

FINDING THE ONE: WEDDING DRESSES FROM WHITEHORSE

In this centrepiece exhibition, set against a backdrop of local landscapes from the Whitehorse Art Collection, wedding dresses are on loan from Whitehorse Historical Society. Featuring the 1910 wedding dress of Mary Schwerkolt, a woman who lived through two World Wars and experienced the government confiscation of her family home in Mitcham.

Despite the trials and hardships on our life journeys, these dresses and their settings hold the power to evoke universal happy moments.


